 - An order of go will be established by level, starting with L7 in descending order. Be ready when it's your turn.

 - Sound check for Masters level and WAWE qualifying riders.

Entry

USAWWE Region 6 Championship and WAWWE International Show and WE at Grange Park Equine Center entry forms may be found [HERE](#)

Form includes stabling and optional teams entry.

- Championship Show competitors: Be sure to include your qualifying scores on the entry form.
- L2 – L7 competitors: You may indicate a specific song and version on your entry form that you would like to have for your Speed trial. If no song is indicated, we will choose for you.
- An entry form is not valid unless it is fully completed and has all the proper signatures, membership numbers, and equine information. Each entry form must have the original signatures (not copies) of Riders/Handlers and Owner/Agent. An adult must sign for any youth rider.
- Entries must be received by the closing date. Entries received after the closing date will be assessed a \$50 late fee. Late entries will be placed on a waiting list and included in the schedule, if possible.
- No phone entries will be accepted.
- Entries are accepted on a first-paid, first-served basis.
- For the Championship Show, there will be a Veterinarian Inspection on check-in day.

Team Competition (optional)

The organizing member (Team Captain) of each team must complete the Team Entry Form with the other names of their team members. Teams without at least 3 members will not be included in the team scoring.

- Each team consists of three or four members.
- Teams of three can enter with no dropped score.
- Each member must be entered in the Working Equitation show as an individual competitor.
- Teams may include riders from the same barn, club, region, family, or mixed group from any level.
- A rider/equine pair may be listed on only one team for the show.
- Substitutions may be allowed before the first team member rides, at the discretion of show management.
- Individual placings are unaffected by team results.
- Eligible Scores
 - Team scores are based on the individual scores earned by team members in Dressage and Ease of Handling.

Competition **Requirements**

Only USAWE current members are eligible to compete in a championship show.

An equine-rider combination must earn a combined average of 58% or higher in Dressage and EOH (L1-L7) and successfully complete the Speed trial (L2-L7) at a minimum of two licensed shows to be eligible for the Championship show. For the 2026 competition year, the qualifying period is January 1, 2025 through the show entry deadline in 2026. At least one of the scores must be earned during the current competition year

All competitors must hold a current membership with USAWE.

All competing horses must be recorded with USAWE in advance of the show. A one-time fee of \$30 per horse includes lifetime performance tracking.

Riders with disabilities can apply for a Dispensation Certificate that approves the use of adaptive equipment and other allowances. The certificate must be approved prior to the competition and a copy submitted with the entry form.

Coggins Test

Photocopy of a negative Coggins test, dated no earlier than October 25, 2025, is required and must be uploaded or emailed to the secretary for online entries.

Entries without a current (valid through show date) negative Coggins test result will not be allowed to show or remain on the premises.

Any non-competing equines must have an entry form and negative Coggins test submitted electronically.

Pennsylvania State law requires a current health certificate for equines arriving from out of state.



Prizes/Awards



Champion, Reserve Champion, and third thru sixth place rosettes will be awarded to the overall Equine-Rider teams in each level/division. Prizes and/or monies may be award to the Champion and Reserve Champion, as well, depending on sponsorships.

Rosettes are awarded from 1st thru 6th place for all divisions in each level.

Specialty awards will be given dependent on sponsorships.

There will be an overall High Score award for the top Open, Amateur, and Youth riders for the Championship Show. They will be determined by the highest average Dressage/EOH score from all levels/divisions.

There will be an overall High Score Dressage, High Score EOH awards for the WE at Grange Park show.

An Awards Ceremony will be held for the L1 competitors on Saturday. For the L2-L7 competitors, it will be held at the close of the show on Sunday.

The required protocol is as follows:

- Rider must be in show attire.
- Rider may be mounted or dismounted.
- Equine may be in full tack or bridle only with their bridle number attached.

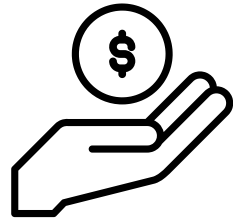

Refunds

Full Refunds minus the office fee will be issued for cancelations prior to closing date. After the closing date, refunds will be granted with a note from physician or veterinarian and at the sole discretion of show management.

Stabling Details

Pennsylvania State law requires a current health certificate for equines arriving from out of state. Your animal cannot be stabled on the grounds without a health certificate or a current negative Coggins test.

Competitors may show out of their trailer. There will be a \$30 charge (for the weekend).

Arrival: Wednesday, October 21, 2026, starting at 9:00 a.m.

Departure: Monday, October 26, 2026, by 8:00 a.m.

Early arrivals/late departures must be coordinated with and approved by the Stable Manager and will be subject to an additional \$45 charge per stall per day.

Emergency contact information must be prominently displayed on all stalls housing an animal, including both cell phone and local contact information.

Shavings may be purchased from Grange Park for \$10/bag.
No Straw Bedding Allowed.

Signing up for this event requires you to abide by the following terms and conditions while on the Grange Park premises, as well as any/all facilities that Working Equitation East contracts with to use referenced facilities. Failure to do so may lead to potential consequences regarding membership to WE East, USAWE, and/or WAVE.

The Eastern Regions Championship show and the WE at Grange Park show will be conducted and judged in accordance with the United States Rules for Working Equitation. The WAVE International Working Equitation Regulations will also apply to Riders competing in the WAVE International event.

**IT IS THE COMPETITOR'S RESPONSIBILITY TO
READ AND UNDERSTAND THE RULES PRIOR TO
THE COMPETITION.**



Riders must be correctly attired and equines properly presented in accordance with the U.S. Rules for Working Equitation and WAVE International Working Equitation Regulations, as applicable. Show Management may, at its discretion, bar any person or animal from entering the arena if not suitably presented.

A rider must compete in the division designated on their USAWE membership application, i.e., Youth, Amateur, or Open. See U.S. Rules for Working Equitation, Appendix G, for details.

Working Equitation East reserves the right to refuse an entry for any reason.

Working Equitation East and Grange Park reserve the right to maintain a Harassment Free Environment and may remove or refuse entry to any person(s) disrupting the show.

Hold Harmless Clause:

Understanding that equestrian sports may be hazardous and dangerous, even leading to permanent injury or death, each owner, rider, spectator, and other participant assumes any and all risk of loss or injury and agrees to hold harmless, regardless, the horse show personnel and the facility hosting the show. Working Equitation East and Grange Park Equine Center will not be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, animals, or property of exhibitors, spectators, or grooms. All local facility rules must be followed.

Motor Vehicle Operation:

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Media Release Agreement:

Photographs and videos are being taken throughout the course of the competition. Officials, Competitors, Volunteers, and other attendees may take media that captures individuals and animals in the background. No media will be used in any manner to jeopardize any amateur status or advertise any product, outside of promoting USAWE or Working Equitation East. The organization reserves the right to utilize any media it has obtained permissions and rights from the photographers and primary subjects to use for marketing purposes. There is no compensation associated with the use of any media.

Land and Facility Information

Facility Requirements

Camping

Camping is only allowed in designated areas. RVs are only permitted to plug into designated camp- site boxes. Absolutely NO plugging into the barns, tent pad outlets, or vendor area power outlets.

RVs and trailers must display current camping permit. No dumping of gray water. No cooking or sleeping in the barns. No open fires or deep fryers. **NO DRY CAMPING.**

No empty trailers are permitted in the RV areas.

Animals/Pets

Dogs are allowed on the show grounds. All dogs must be on a leash and under the control of a handler or suitably restrained in a stall/RV/Trailer/ect. Dogs found in distress in trailers or cars will be removed at the owners expense.

Smoking

Absolutely no smoking is allowed in the barns or arenas.
